Discussion themes

- Questions about how to integrate deeper outreach into non white communities.
- Sam has lived in the neighborhood for 10 years, facing housing issues.

Community needs Conversation

- Home owners control costs of living within neighborhoods
- Only in power to KYS holdings.
- Government Road spots have collapsed, making it very difficult to leave the district.
- Tree canopies, too narrow of sidewalks.
- Suggestion to open and expand the parks and recs program with PB to.
- Old Residents want better bus access, new residents want more bike lines.
- Hearing a lot about public transportation and safety.
- The bus stops aren't the problem, it's the frequency of the routes. Sidewalk projects should be "last resort".
- Poor smelling water, potential gas leaks.
- Identifying that fulton is not the district with families that it once was, is largely composed of young, single adults.

RVAPB notes

- Matthew reiterates the chronological line for PB to orient the meeting once more. Question about accessibility programs and ADA compliance.
- City is responsible for the project itself.
- Undocumented Folks should be able to participate in RVAPB as well to give agency to folks who are otherwise excluded from Richmond Politics.
- Reiteration of this process as a "pilot".
- How to manage expectations?
- Most of our clients read at a third grade level, ascertain the limits of the program.
- Do voting on weekends when less people are likely to be voting.
- More clarity on how commission members are decided.
- Be realistic about timelines when it comes to longer term projects such as infra.
- Find a way to make residents the center of spending.

- The goal is to pull as much data as possible to prepare for this process to function in a steady fashion.
- Appeasing potential concerns.
- The scope of some larger infra problems will be hard to work into the initial budget.
